OBJECTIVES

The overarching objective of the Safe Hut project is to foster the social and labour integration of women and adolescent girls who are victims or survivors of trafficking, through the establishment of safe spaces – environments dedicated to empowering and supporting them on their journey towards recovery and autonomy.

WINGS

OBJECTIVES

The WINGS Project sought to support women survivors of trafficking through the implementation of a comprehensive and holistic integration programme.

PROTECTION AND SUPPORT

AMELIE

OBJECTIVES

The Amelie Project supports healthcare and frontline service providers in identifying, safely referring, and delivering gender- and trauma-sensitive services to individuals affected by trafficking.

TOOLS

- ✓ A comprehensive **e-learning course** for healthcare professionals, offering a thorough understanding of the complexities of human trafficking, a holistic approach to victim support, and the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on trafficking.



TOLERANT

OBJECTIVES

The TOLERANT project focused on the integration of women who have been victims of trafficking for sexual exploitation into the labour market.

TOOLS

- ✓ An integrated **service provision guide** to enhance employment access for third-country national women victims of trafficking for sexual exploitation.



ACTIONS COMBATTING HUMAN TRAFFICKING

BLUERIGHTS

OBJECTIVES

The BlueRights Project – Sub-Group 2.2 focuses on forced labour, modern slavery, and trafficking at sea. It assesses legal frameworks, identifies best practices, and proposes measures to better protect personal liberty and combat exploitation in maritime contexts.

TOOLS

- ✓ A comprehensive summary of coastal state jurisdiction within the territorial sea and the protection of individuals on board foreign-flagged vessels.



A4

OBJECTIVES

A4 aimed to combat impunity for trafficking of women and girls for sexual exploitation, focusing on victim protection at the EU's south-eastern border. Led by police cooperation between Austria, Bulgaria, and Greece, it developed tailored tools, built LEA capacity, piloted a cross-border response, and promoted victim-centred investigations.

TENACITY

OBJECTIVES

TENACITY addresses key issues in travel intelligence use by European law enforcement, including data quality and access. It follows a three-pillar approach: interoperable analysis tools, stakeholder training through a “living lab,” and a governance framework to support crime prevention and policy-making.

TOOLS

- ✓ A comprehensive research report on citizen perceptions of cross-border security processes and requirements to engender engagement and trust
- ✓ A training methodology and curricula to equip law enforcement, especially PIUs, with skills to use TENACITY Tools, focusing on AI, Blockchain, and OSINT through experiential learning.
- ✓ A selection of articles on transport exploitation, migrant smuggling, and API/PNR challenges in Europe.



ERADICATING I & II

OBJECTIVES

ERADICATING and ERADICATING II are transnational initiatives to strengthen the capacity of law enforcement and frontline professionals in preventing and identifying trafficking for sexual and labour exploitation. The first project focused on training, cross-border cooperation, and awareness-raising through a human rights-based, gender-sensitive lens. Building on this, the second project targets labour exploitation with particular attention to the heightened risks faced by Ukrainian refugees in the context of war and displacement.

TOOLS

- ✓ A digital library that brings together a wide range of EU-funded initiatives working to combat human trafficking and support its victims
- ✓ A series of factsheets and national executive summaries compiling evidence about the support and protection of victims of trafficking in European countries.
- ✓ Specialised training toolkits and pocket size guides for first line professionals and general public.
- ✓ A training manual on conducting “Living Labs” in Bulgaria, Greece, and Germany to combat trafficking in human beings and child sexual exploitation.



LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES (LEAS)
